

## #snfccAtHome: Colors and emotions in young Picasso's work Self-made Cubist portrait

### INSTRUCTIONS

**Step 1:** Choose a photograph of your face and print it or draw your self-portrait.

**Tip:** Instead, you can use an image from a newspaper or a magazine.

**Step 2:** By using a ruler, draw random lines onto your portrait, so as to divide it in smaller sections.

**Step 3:** If you use a photograph, create a colourful portrait by combining three different techniques:

- a) Colour each section with different colours
- b) Draw borders / outlines
- c) Highlight some of the features of your face

**Step 4:** Cut in big pieces the sections of your face (up to 20).

**Step 5:** Take the paper cylinder from the kitchen paper and add a layer of glue on all of its' surface.

Glue first the basic features of the face, for example the eyes, the nose and the mouth. Later on, add all the other features.

**Tip:** On the final sculpture, you can also add colourful bits of paper or newspaper in order to enhance the "analysis" of the portrait in smaller shapes.

### Materials:

Ruler, scissor, stick glue, paper cylinder (from the kitchen paper), colours (coloured pencils, magic markers, pastels or whatever you prefer)

### Optional materials:

Camera, printer, bits of a newspaper / magazine
