



Spyros Yiotakis

He was born in Athens in 1990. He holds a degree in Architecture from the National Technical University of Athens (2016) and an MSc from the same school in Design, Space and Culture (2020). Since 2016 he has been working as a freelance architect, and in 2021 he founded the "17 Ieronos Architecture Workshop," a network of collaborators focusing on design-oriented research. He has participated in several national and international architectural design competitions, and his distinction include: 1st prize (together with Agis Mourelatos) at the national student architecture competition for the Visitors Center of the SNFCC; 2nd prize (together with Kimon Konstantaras, Nikos Labrou, Margarita Zakynthinou) at the national student architecture competition for "Urban Sign," a wooden structure in the public space; 3rd Prize (together with Theoni Xanthi, Thodoris Androulakis, Margarita Zakynthinou) at the international architecture competition of the University of Cyprus for the building of its Medical School; 1st Prize (together with Theoni Xanthi, Thodoris Androulakis, Margarita Zakynthinou) at the international architecture competition for the New Cyprus Museum; 1st mention (together with Kimon Konstantaras and Georgia Katsi) at the international architecture competition for the regeneration of Lycabettus Hill; 2nd prize (together with Kimon Konstantaras and Magdalini Petroleka) at the national architecture competition for a Kindergarten & Adult Day Care Center in Chania, Crete. In 2015, the SNFCC Visitors Center was nominated for the European Union Prize for Contemporary Architecture - Mies van der Rohe Award. His research focuses on defining, in an urban design scale, an intermediate space between the background of antiquity and the contemporary city. These interests are also developing through his assistant teaching work at the NTUA and his participation as invited speaker in relevant lectures.

Agis Mourelatos

Agis Mourelatos attended High School at the Experimental School of the University of Athens, to then receive a university degree, with a special commendation for the overall promotion of the institution, from the Department of Architectural Engineering of the University of Patras. In 2013, he was awarded, along with Spyros Yiotakis, by Renzo Piano for the design of the Visitors Center of the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center, which was his first implemented project while he was still a university student. He has been honored with awards in local and international competitions and has been participating extensively in national architectural design competitions. In 2018, he was distinguished with the award "Best first work of a young architect of the years 2013--2017" by DOMES, and in 2015, he was nominated for the European Union Prize for Contemporary Architecture - Mies van der Rohe Award. Also in 2015, he founded his Athens-based architectural office, Agis Mourelatos | Architects, with the main goal of promoting research through design.
